- God of wilderness and water, your Son was baptised and tempted as we are. Guide us through this season of Lent, not so that we may avoid struggle, but so that we may open ourselves to blessing. When we go through wildernesses, may we know your presence with us, and when we face temptations may your power protect us. Fill our hearts with joy of the good news you bring us. - We pray for the innocent victims of war. May there be an end to hostilities between Israel and the Palestinians,

May adequate immediate provision be made available, and support to find longer term solutions, so that everyone has their basic needs met for food, shelter, employment and security.
