There seems to be a lot going on at the moment, as you'll see inside this issue. It's good to have two concerts coming up in the next few weeks. We haven't been able to do much fund-raising this year and miss not only the income, but also the opportunities to socialize and have fun. One reason why we haven't had many events is that we haven't had enough people to organise them. Could you be part of a group that organises fundraising and social events? Or perhaps you could just organise a fundraiser yourself. It doesn't have to be on a large scale as smaller events are just as effective. If you could help in this way, I'd love to hear from you.

As we go into winter, the cost of heating is a matter of concern to many of us, and the church is no exception. In line with our efforts to reduce our carbon footprint, we've been looking at ways we can reduce our electricity and gas usage. We've recently replaced the lights in the nave of St Mary's and the main hall in the Guildhall with LED units, which should be much more efficient and last longer. The experts often advise that we should concentrate on heating the person, not the whole building and, with this in mind, last winter we had blankets available to people sitting in church. This was welcomed by many, so if you could help us by knitting or crocheting more blankets, it would be much appreciated. Please speak to Wendy for more details.

Finally, October is the time of year when the PCC looks at its finances and plans its budgets for the following year. We don't know yet whether we will be facing a deficit, but I would like to ask you to consider whether there might be a way you could support the church financially. Environment Matters



This month's Eco Living tips from Kathy were first published in October 2020.

As winter approaches, this is a good time to check for any draughts coming through gaps around windows and doors. Fill the gaps, put a draught

excluder on your letter box, use a 'sausage dog' along the bottom of your front door and along inside doors (cover a roll of newspaper with some old fabric, or knit or crochet a cover – you could add embroidery or applique and make a stylish design to match your room decor). Use a chimney balloon (or an old pillow case filled with scrunched up newspapers) to stop draughts coming down the chimney. Tie a piece of string to the pillow case so that it hangs down into the fireplace after you have pushed the balloon into the chimney. Then you will see that there is something to remove before next lighting a fire.

Replace lightbulbs with low energy bulbs such as LEDs. They should last longer than the older bulbs, so are more convenient too. And then don't forget to turn off the lights you don't need when you leave the room.

If you haven't already done so, switch your energy provider to one which provides renewably produced electricity.

Choose to eat seasonally and locally grown vegetables. As well as tasting delicious, plantbased foods are better for the planet!

Reflection by Philip Baker

Out of curiosity, I recently checked on-line for which "Awareness Days" were coming up in November and I was genuinely astonished at the range of contenders: everything from a World Kindness Day to a World Vegan Day; there is an Apple Day, a Brush Day (!), there is even a Social Media Awareness month, a National Spa week and a National Sandwich Day (honestly, these are all listed on-line, I am not making it up). Unsurprisingly perhaps, among the vast range of special days, weeks or months there is no mention of any need of "being prepared for God to come".

Whilst it is no doubt good to bring many of these causes to mind, Luke 12:40 reminds us that "you must also be ready, because the Son of Man will come at an hour when you do not expect him." The one thing foremost in our minds should be "are we ready?". How many times have we parted from someone and almost immediately thought of something we had intended to say or do – but it is now too late. We do not want to be in a similar position should we find ourselves face to face with our Lord, because what we have not done will no longer be possible.

So, what are we supposed to have done? A recent Sunday sermon in my parish church gave the answer to that in a consideration of Mark 10:35-45. If you read that section, you will see that we are expected to be humble, be a servant and serve all. This is where the passage "For even the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve" appears. Matthew 6:19 refers to the need for us not to seek our reward on earth but in heaven "where neither moth nor rust destroys and where thieves do not break in and steal" - in other words, a reward which is durable and lasting. It is a guide we would do well to follow: be humble, act like Jesus, serving others without expecting any reward, other than God's. Perhaps the World Kindness Day is not so far off the mark after all!

As a women-led movement with a passion for transforming and improving family and community life, the Mothers Union is deeply concerned about the number of people globally who cannot read or write, many of whom are women. Knowing that there are so many women around the world who lack the ability to read or write, I have added my voice to the MU 'Empower Her' Literacy campaign, and I am encouraging others to do the same.
