Holy Habits for Life

One of the most influential books on my life is 'Celebration of Discipline', by Richard Foster, which I first read in the early 1980s. It has since become a classic, exploring the ancient 'spiritual disciplines' and their relevance for Christians today. These are basically the holy habits that we may adopt, which help us grow in character and Christ-likeness. It has long been recognised that when we do something regularly, it changes us, for good or ill. These practices don't make us right with God, but help us live as faithful followers of Jesus, and grow more like him. During Lent, we will be focussing on some of these holy habits, as we reflect on our readings, the Collects, and hear from those who have made these their own. I would love to hear from anyone who would be willing to share their own experience, either writing something for the service leader to read out, or coming forward to speak. The themes are here, not an exhaustive list of holy habits, but should give us enough to be going on with!

Environment Matters

This month's column is a version of Kathy's Eco Living tips first published in March 2022.



Have you considered how much energy is used for lighting and the extent to which it adds to light pollution? The Campaign to Protect of Rural England says "Light pollution wastes energy and money, has negative effects on wildlife and more recently has sparked major concerns about the harmful effects it can have on people, not only by disrupting their sleep but the human ability to naturally produce hormones."

Psalm 19 starts 'The heavens declare the glory of God; the skies proclaim the work of his hands'. Too much light outside stops us from seeing what God created – stars, moon, planets, etc.

If you have lights in your garden, remember to turn them off when you are not there. Night time lighting has been shown to disrupt wildlife's natural patterns, by drawing migratory birds off course, and distracting insects from their job of pollinating flowers. Wildlife is better equipped than humans to see in the dark and does not need artificial lighting.

Close your curtains to keep light (and heat) inside your home, rather than allowing it to spill out into the night, and remember to turn lights off as you leave a room, to save energy.

Do you want a say about what happens in this parish now and in the future?

If the answer to this question is 'Yes', then please consider joining the church's Electoral Roll, or register of electors. In the same way that being on the civic Electoral Roll allows you to vote in parliamentary and local elections and referenda, joining the Church Electoral Roll means that you can vote on the Parish Church matters. All Church of England parishes have to completely renew their Electoral Rolls every 6 years and this renewal is due this year. Everyone who wishes to be on the Electoral Roll will therefore have to reregister. For more details of what it means to be on the Electoral Role, see the February edition of Contact. The forms are now available in church, together with a box for completed forms, which must be returned by 23rd March.

Reflection by Philip Baker

Have you noticed how frequently the number 40 crops up in the Bible? Moses spent 40 days on the mountain being prepared to lead the Israelites out of Egypt (Exodus 24:18), culminating in the second set of stones bearing what we refer to as the 10 Commandments (Exodus 34:28 – the first set of stones Moses destroyed, see Exodus 32:15-20. The earth was flooded for 40 days to rid the earth of creatures except those saved in the ark (Genesis 7:12), and there are many more. On Ash Wednesday (which falls this year on 5th March) we enter the 40 days of Lent, which many suggest recalls the 40 days Jesus spent being tempted in the desert (Matthew 4:1-11) and is a period of contemplation culminating in the deeply contrasting events, emotions and ultimate glory of Easter.

Traditionally we mark our 40 days of Lent by denying ourselves something, such as chocolate, but I have a suggestion. The Bible is interesting and reading it helps us to understand our faith so, for a change from the usual, how about giving up a little time each day to think of God and read the Bible? There are lots of plans available on line, although I use a completely free app on my phone (YouVersion) which offers several plans to choose from, including reading the whole Bible in 365 days (that is what I do and it takes around 15 minutes a day).

Alternatively, try to read the first 24 chapters from the book of Exodus (which includes the 40 days Moses spent on Mount Sinai) and all 28 chapters of the Gospel of Matthew (which is the story of Jesus up to His Resurrection at the end of our 40 days of Lent). That should be an easy read in 40 days. taking about 15 minutes each day for a chapter from each. If that is not enough (or instead), for a lovely story of faith and love read Ruth, which is really short.

Whatever we do, let us make sure we remember God's amazing love for us as shown by the sacrifice He made on the Cross, followed by His example of rising to life again.
