Our man in heaven

Where is Jesus now? That's a question I have been asked many times. Did he die again after he rose? Where did he go? It's an understandable question, and actually really important.

Ascension Day is exactly 40 days after Easter, which this year will be 29th May. You may have come across traditions of choirs singing from very tall buildings early in the morning on Ascension Day, as a way of marking the day, remembering the accounts of Jesus ascending to his Father in heaven. The post-resurrection appearances of Jesus come to an end, and from then on in the New Testament, all references to Jesus are about him being at the Father's right hand in heaven - a place of the highest honour, glory and power, having conquered sin and death.

But Jesus didn't stop being human. Jesus returned to the glory of heaven, taking all that it means to be human to become part of all that God is. Jesus is God and remains man – he bears forever the scars of the wounds suffered for us. He is 'Our Man in Heaven.'

The book of Hebrews talks of Jesus praying for us, so that we can come with confidence before God knowing that Jesus knows our humanity, knows our weakness and understands our needs.

But...Jesus was not leaving the world behind and leaving us to get on with things by ourselves. Jesus was gone, but he had promised that the disciples would not be left on their own, as orphans. The Holy Spirit would come on the Day of Pentecost, so that under the guidance of the Spirit, God's abiding presence, they, and all who were to follow, would be given power to witness to Jesus, to take the life of heaven into all of the world, to bring transformation and new life.

Alleluia! Not as orphans
are we left in sorrow now.
Alleluia! He is near us;
faith believes, nor questions how.
Tho' the cloud from sight received Him
when the forty days were o'er,
shall our hearts forget His promise,
"I am with you evermore"?

Environment Matters

A version of this month's Eco Living tips from Kathy was first published in May 2022



Plantlife (a conservation charity which works to save threatened wild flowers, plants and fungi) has been running 'No Mow May' since 2019. The charity suggests that you do not mow your lawn during May, which will allow wild flowers to bloom, providing nectar for insects to enjoy, and flowers for you to enjoy.

After 'No Mow May', Plantlife suggests you keep some of your lawn cut short, mowing it just once a month, (for the shorter flowers such as daisies and clover) and leave some uncut (good for ox-eye daisies). Some people have had orchids grow in their lawns. We have been pleased to have extra colour in our garden from speedwell, dandelions, daisies and clover. These attract butterflies and all sorts of bees.

Added bonuses of reducing lawn mowing are that you cut your carbon footprint (especially if you use a fossil-fuel powered mower), you save time, and, the more species of plants in your lawn, the more carbon that is stored in your lawn. See www.plantlife.org.uk for more information.
