FOR YOUR PRAYERS:

- Lord of all, we give you thanks for the freedom and peace we enjoy today, remembering with gratitude those who gave their lives in war and conflict. We thank you for their courage, their sacrifice, and their steadfast hope that a better world might be born. We pray for all who still bear the scars of conflict: for veterans and their families, for the wounded in body, mind, or spirit. Grant that we may never forget the cost of peace, and that we may live as people worthy of their sacrifice.
- We pray for the people of Gaza, who still live and move among the wreckage of war. We pray for the hostages who have endured two years of captivity, and for the families welcoming them home. We ask God to pour healing love and patience into lives undergoing such huge changes.
- We also continue to pray for an end to the war in Ukraine. Be near to those who are anxious; bring comfort to all who are suffering.
- We pray for world leaders and those in positions of power. May they work for justice, peace, and the dignity of all people, especially the poor and marginalised. May they seek to serve rather than to be served.
- For the work of organisations helping families around the world to overcome poverty and injustice, wherever the need is greatest, and there is high risk of famine

including: Myanmar, Haiti, Afghanistan, Ethiopia, Yemen, Syria, DRC, South Sudan.

- For all affected by the horrific knife attack on the train to London last Saturday evening, we pray for the injured and those traumatised by witnessing the awful event.
- We give thanks for the beauty of our world. We pray for people whose lives are destroyed by floods, heatwaves, earthquakes, volcanic eruptions and other natural occurrences. Help us to care actively for this world, to take responsibility for looking after it rather than simply using and abusing it. We pray that world leaders, local governments and communities work together to protect our common home.
- For all those struggling in today's difficult economic situation. May adequate immediate provision be made available, and support to find longer term solutions, so that everyone has their basic needs met for food, shelter, employment and security. For national and international governments as they tackle the economic and social issues which affect them. May those in authority act with wisdom and justice to bring greatest good for the greatest number of people.
- We give thanks for the gift of community, a place where we can connect, support, and encourage one another. We pray for unity, understanding, and love among all members. Help us to see each other as your children, and to treat each other with kindness and compassion. We ask for your protection and blessings over our community, that we may flourish in your love and peace.
- For the new Archbishop of Canterbury, Bishop Sarah Mullally for grace to fulfil this challenging role, for wisdom, discernment, humility and courage. For our leaders as the Diocese continues the process of choosing a new Bishop of Ely.
